Black History Month is a national annual observance for remembrance of important people and events in the history of the African Diaspora. It is celebrated annually in February in the United States, Canada and the United Kingdom.

The remembrance originated in 1926 by historian <u>Carter G. Woodson</u> as "Negro History Week." Woodson chose the second week of February because it marked the birthdays of two Americans who greatly influenced the lives and social condition of African Americans: former President Abraham Lincoln and abolitionist and former slave Frederick Douglass.
